Tips for Program Success

Get the most out of your recycling and organics collection services

- 1. Single-use plastics are on their way out!

 IT'S THE LAW that all disposable to-go food ware in Alameda must be reusable, or compostable. Businesses must provide:
- straws only on request
- fiber-based compostable disposables (paper, wood, bamboo, etc.)
- reusable dishware where possible

- **2.** Avoid contamination. Sort plastic waste properly; Styrofoam® products, plastic wrap, and non-recyclable packaging belong in your **Garbage** cart or bin.
- **3.** Flatten boxes to maximize space, fold/cut to pieces 2' x 2' or smaller, before placing in your **Recyclables** cart or bin. Pieces should fit loosely to assure the cart will empty properly during service.
- **4.** Remember that food scraps and food-soiled paper belongs in your **Organics** cart or bin.

Recycling is Mandatory

To be compliant, Alameda businesses (and multifamily residential properties) must have



an appropriate level of Recyclables and Organics collection service in place. Businesses are required to sort their trash, and may be cited if contamination is found in their bins and/or carts.

StopWaste Grant Programs

Community Outreach Mini Grants are designed to help reduce the amount of organics, specifically edible food, going to landfill. Grants are available to qualifying nonprofit organizations that have the capacity and desire to work with their local community, to build awareness and engagement in reducing food waste at the household level.



General Mini Grant Program is designed to provide small amounts of money, to all Alameda County based applicants. The proposed project must be in the area of source reduction, reuse, recycling and market development. Funds may also be requested for educational programs that promote source reduction, reuse, recycling and buying recycled.

Reusable Transport Packaging Grants *Use Reusables* is offering up to \$5,000 per approved business or institution for the purchase of reusable transport packaging. Applications will be evaluated on a first come first serve basis until grant funds are expended.
