State Law Senate Bill 1383 (SB 1383)

New California State Law, SB 1383 aims to keep food and other compostable materials (“organics”) out of landfills to reduce emissions that contribute to climate change. The new law includes all generators of waste.

What does this mean for my multi-family property?

To be compliant, your multi-family residential property must:

- Provide and have an appropriate level of Recyclables and Organics collection service in place.*
- Provide containers for the Collection of Source Separated Organic Materials and Source Separated Recyclable Materials in all common areas where those materials are being generated.
- Sort materials into the proper bins:
 - **Compost:** Food scraps, paper, and plant waste.
 - **Recycling:** Clean containers.
 - **Avoid Contamination:** Do not place garbage into the recycling or compost bins, and do not place recyclables or compost into the garbage bin. Visit: www.alamedacountyindustries.com/alameda/multifamily/resouces/ for a list of what belongs where, downloadable posters, flyers, videos, and more.
- Educate and train all employees, contractors, and tenants about SB 1383 requirements at least annually.*
- Inform tenants no later than 14 days after move-in and at least 14 days prior to move-out about the rules. For more information visit: stopwaste.org/rules.



The “BAGS TO BINS” Poster Tool



Customize posters to help employees, tenants, and custodians put things in the right bins and avoid contamination fees.

- Choose the right bags, bins, and pickup days for your property.
- Print and hang posters in a prominent (non-public) location as a daily reminder.
- Also works great as your annual recycling reminder to employees, tenants & contractors.

SB 1383 Starts January 1st, 2022!

SB 1383 regulations will be implemented under Chapter 21 (Solid Waste and Recycling) of the City of Alameda’s Municipal Code through a partnership among ACI, StopWaste, and the Alameda County of Environmental Health Department. Household Hazardous Waste & E-Waste Program

Hazardous waste **DOES NOT BELONG** in the garbage, recycling or organics containers.



Before tossing it out, check the label. If it's marked Danger, Warning, Poisonous, Toxic, or Flammable, it's hazardous and requires special handling.
