Proper Sorting Makes a Difference

Sorting your waste correctly means placing it in the correct container:

- compliance with City and State regulations
- a reduction in the amount of material going to the landfill
- a reduction in greenhouse gas emissions

Small Sorting Actions That Make a HUGE Impact

FLATTEN CARDBOARD

Corrugated cardboard and paper boxes should be flattened, and large pieces cut to fit in the bin or cart. Doing so:

- allows for more room in the container
- prevents overflow and litter

KEEP IT CLEAN & LOOSE

- Empty, wipe or rinse recyclable plastic, metal, and glass food containers; and make sure recyclable paper is clean and dry.
- Keep your recyclables unbagged inside your collection containers.

DID YOU KNOW

Recyclables in bags (especially opaque/black ones) are sorted out as garbage and end up in the landfill.
