Prepare for Rainy Season



he rainy season, typically between November and March in Castro Valley, can present many challenges to homeowners. Avoid expensive accidents by preparing your property today and protecting your home! If possible, it's best to be proactive – not reactive. One action that can help is to install a backflow prevention system (BPS), which consists of a two-way cleanout and a backflow prevention device (BPD). The BPS is designed to keep water and sewage flowing in the right direction – away from the home!
