NEW Curbside Collection Services! HOUSEHOLD BATTERIES, USED COOKING OIL, AND EXTRA CARDBOARD (FLATTENED AND CUT TO SIZE)

• ACI will collect household batteries placed in a zipperstyle bag on top of your blue **recyclables** collection cart. Please tape the terminals on 9 volt and lithium batteries before placing them in the bag. No automotive batteries

are allowed. For additional disposal information of house hold hazardous waste (HHW) items visit www.stopwaste.org/at-home/household-hazardous-waste

• Curbside collection of used cooking oil in 1-gallon, or smaller, sealed screw-top containers. Place next to your recyclables cart*

• Extra cardboard will be collected curbside if it is flattened, cut down to pieces no larger than 2 feet by 3 feet, and stacked next to your blue recyclables cart. (*Pieces larger than* 2 feet by 3 feet will not fit in the hopper of the collection vehicle and will not be picked up.)



Collection Day Reminders

- Place carts out for collection by 6:00am and remove prior to 12:00am the following day.
- Make sure cart wheels are facing your home.
- Leave three feet (or as much space as possible) between each cart and avoid placing carts near obstacles.
- Place materials loosely in carts so they will empty properly.
- Make sure cart lids are fully closed. Overloaded carts can cause litter, attract critters and result in non-collection.
- Report damaged carts to ACI so that we can schedule a repair or replacement on your next service day.
- *Oil Collection: Oil must be at the curb in 1-gallon or smaller, sealed screw-top container (3 total gallons per week). Free oil jugs and oil filter bags may be requested from ACI.

Keep Recyclables Out of the Landfill

Avoid contamination and protect our sorting staff by properly sorting your waste. Make sure the items you place in your RECYCLABLES cart are recyclable.

- Styrofoam[®], plastic wrap, and non-recyclable packaging belong in your GARBAGE cart.
- Food scraps and food-soiled paper belong in your **ORGANICS** cart.
- Keep it clean. Make sure recyclable plastic, metal, and glass food containers are empty, clean, and dry before placing them in the RECYCLABLES cart.



Remember, NØ Sharps!

"Sharps" is a medical term for devices with sharp points or edges that can puncture or cut skin such as needles, syringes, lancets, auto injectors (such as EpiPens), and infusions sets.
