



California's Compost & Recycling Law for Businesses

Senate Bill 1383 (SB 1383) will help keep compostable materials out of landfills.

What does this law mean for my business?

- All sites must have compost and recycling collection service.
- Compost and recycling bins must be placed next to all garbage bins indoors, except in restrooms. Items must also be properly sorted into the bins.
- Free help and indoor green bins are available.
- Large businesses that generate surplus edible food—such as grocery stores, food distributors, and large restaurants—must donate food to food recovery organizations.

- Funding priorities are related to projects that focus on waste prevention, reuse, and recovery of food, goods and materials as well as development, marketing, and use of recovered products.
- Proposed projects must be located in and/or service the residents and/or businesses of Alameda County.
