In this edition of the Pipeline, find information on our Lateral Replacement Grant Program, the next textile collection event, and what to do if you need to get rid of an old mattress.



VSan staff are in the process of finalizing the scope and basis of ◆ the design for our next gravity. sewer repair and replacement project. CVSan has budgeted \$2.5 million for sewer rehabilitation work to be put out to bid in the spring of 2025. These repairs will be focused on the most severe defects with high consequences of failure in our service district. With the cost of pipeline repairs increasing each year, CVSan is always looking for new techniques and strategies to repair and replace aging infrastructure.

Lateral Replacement **Grant Program (LRGP)**



o you need to replace your Private Sewer Lateral (PSL)? We are here to help! This year's Lateral Replacement Grant Program (LRGP) is scheduled to start at 7:30 a.m. on Monday, August 12, 2024. The LRGP is designed to help defray a portion of the costs when a property owner or their agent is required to replace the PSL, including the connection to the public sewer main.

We offer financial assistance to qualified applicants to replace defective PSLs at 50% of the approved costs, up to a maximum reimbursement of \$2,000 per PSL. All work for the LRGP must be performed by a CVSan qualified contractor. A total of \$75,000 has been allocated to the program.

What Are Your Service Rates?

Wastewater

▶ VSan's sewer service charge funds the cost of operations to collect, treat, and annual sewer service charge effective July 1st 2024 is \$550.70 and remains one of the lowest sewer service charges in Alameda County. On May 15, 2023, CVSan's Board of Directors unanimously approved Ordinance No. 195 to increase the sewer service charge by 7%. This current increase represents a \$3.00 increase per month to you over the previous rate. Learn more about your rates and how your rates are calculated at cvsan.org/YourRates.

Solid Waste

n Alameda County, CVSan's singlefamily residential monthly rate based on the 20-gallon garbage cart is below the County average by \$4.16. On May 7th, CVSan's Board of Directors unanimously approved a rate amendment to increase rates for solid waste services by an average of 3.94%, or \$1.36 monthly, for a 20-gallon single-family customer effective July 1, 2024, below the 6% maximum proposed rate increase. Zero Waste Week



ver 300 students from 13 Castro Valley school classrooms participated in our Zero Waste Week Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Mathematics (STEAM) projects. Classrooms received bags of nonrecyclable plastic materials that would have been landfilled, such as foam blocks, foam ear plugs, plastic utensils, coffee cup lids, DVDs, CDs, and unused biotech supplies. Students used these items to create various art displays. We chose these materials because we need to reduce the billions of pounds of non-recyclable plastics that are landfilled in the U.S. every year. Select projects were displayed at the Castro Valley Library during March and April.
