GREEN YOUR GIFT GIVING

Try second-hand first. Shop at vintage or thrift stores, or your local buy-nothing group. **Shop at local stores.** Support local businesses that focus on sustainable, lasting goods. Avoid buying online it creates additional packaging and transportation waste. Give experiences. Gift tickets to a museum, gift cards to a local restaurant, or home-cooked meals, baked goods, and

homemade treats to share.

Bring your own bag when shopping for gifts. Choose recycled content wrapping paper, tags, and cards or even better - make your own with what you already have. Get creative with reusable wrapping. Recycle baskets, tins, jars, and boxes, or use reusable materials like dish towels, t-shirts, and reusable bags.

Try an Alternative Christmas Tree

Avoid a cut or fake plastic tree this year. Go green with a sustainable alternative.

Rent or adopt a tree that is delivered alive and then replanted once you are finished. Search the internet for local sources.

Decorate a plant or tree you already have, or purchase a potted tree that you can use each year or plant after the holidays. Get creative! Make a tree out of books, a photo collage, or wooden frames, the possibilities are endless.



ACI will collect holiday trees curbside from Dec. 26 -Jan. 31 on your regular service day. Check your mailbox in Dec. for our reminder postcard.

REMEMBER:

- Remove all decorations, lights, and the stand.
- Keep trees loose. Do not wrap or bag them.
- Cut your tree in half if it is taller than 6'.
- Small trees can be placed inside your ORGANICS cart.
- Flocked trees are accepted, but will not be composted.
- · Artificial trees are not accepted and belong in the garbage when reuse is no longer viable. Contact us for collection options.

PLEASE NOTE: Tree collection will occur with special trucks at different times than your regular collection services.
