Reusable Items

• Clean, undamaged reusable items. Must be marked "Reuse" and set apart from clean up items. Scan the QR code for a downloadable sign.

Clean Up Items

- Up to three cubic yards (3' x 3' x 9') of materials (including reusable items). See photo above for an example of a set out.
- Contained trash and recyclables. (bagged, boxed, or bundled)
- Yard trimmings and clean wood up to 6 inches in diameter tied in bundles no longer than 4 feet, please bag small/loose trimmings (pressure treated wood is not accepted).

Large Bulky Items

 Up to three (3) large bulky items such as appliances, mattresses, and furniture (up to 150 lbs. each). One item can be electronic waste.

PLEASE NOTE: Fees will be charged for exceeding the volume or the acceptable item limits listed. Extra clean ups can be arranged for a fee. Visit our website or contact us for rates.

SERVICE REMINDER **California Law Requires Recycling &** Composting

Participating fully in an organics and recycling waste diversion program is now required for every resident and business in the City of Alameda.

Properly Manage Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)

Hazardous waste does NOT belong in any ACI collection cart or bin. Before disposal, check the label. If it's marked Danger, Warning,

Poisonous, Toxic, or Flammable, it's hazardous and requires special handling. Many hazardous items can be taken to Alameda County's local HHW collection facility. Take advantage of this free drop-off program. Visit StopWaste.org/hhw for location, hours, and more info.

PLEASE REMEMBER, NO SHARPS!

"Sharps" is a medical term for devices with sharp points or edges that can


puncture or cut skin such as needles, syringes, lancets, auto injectors (such as EpiPens), and infusion sets. PROPERLY SORT YOUR RECYCLABLES
