## Shining 4R Stars











he CVSan 4R Star Business Program certifies businesses that complete ongoing activities in each of the 4R categories – Reduce, Reuse, Recycle, and Rot (organics). Businesses certified as 4R Stars receive a cash award ranging from \$150 to \$525. The award is based on business size and the level of waste diversion. Funds are subject to availability. Businesses who have been certified in the past and get re-certified now as 4R Stars receive a \$25 ad on Facebook promoting their business and its waste-reduction efforts. ## Schedule Your Bulky & Reuse Pick-Up



id you know that Alameda County Industries (ACI) can pick up items for reuse from your home, at no additional cost? Once a year, CVSan residents may request a Bulky & Reuse Pick-Up where items that are still in good working condition - like wearable clothing, usable furniture, and functional electronics - can be accepted for reuse. Considering reusing items before discarding helps reduce waste and extend the life of our landfills. Items in non-working condition like furniture, appliances, car tires, and more can be set out for disposal. To schedule your pick-up, contact ACI at (510) 483-1400. ## **Avoid Clogs this Holiday**



o not let an unwanted sewer clog ruin your holiday season! Please do not pour fats, oils, and grease (FOG) down the drain. When FOG is washed down the drain, it cools and solidifies in your pipes, forming stubborn blockages that can cause sewer overflows.

Follow these simple tips to keep FOG from becoming a problem:

- Cool and Contain: Allow fats, oils, and grease to cool and solidify. Once solid, scrape them into cardboard or paper containers and dispose of them in the compost bin.
- Wipe and Toss: Use paper towels to wipe greasy pots, pans, and dishes before washing them. Dispose of the paper towels in the compost bin.
- Strain and Store: For cooking oil, use a strainer to remove food particles and store the oil in a container for reuse or proper disposal.

By keeping fats, oils, and grease out of your drains, you can enjoy a clog-free holiday season!

### **Prepare for Wetweather**



rotect your home from costly sewer backups! Inspect and maintain your private sewer lateral to ensure it is free of cracks, roots, and blockages. One action that can help is to install a backflow prevention system (BPS) which prevents sewage from flowing back into a building if there is a blockage in the private sewer lateral or the public sewer main. Never pour fats, oils, grease or "flushable" wipes down drains. Taking these simple steps now will help safeguard your property and keep your sewer system flowing smoothly all season.

## **New Building Update**



· VSan's new Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED)-certified Operations and Engineering (O&E) Building is designed with the environment in mind. It includes electric vehicle (EV) charging stations, bike parking, and more open space and landscaping. The building saves water with drip irrigation, water meters, and low-flow fixtures. It uses less energy with LED lights, windows that let in fresh air, and solar panels. Low-pollution materials help keep indoor air clean, and outdoor lights are designed to reduce light pollution and avoid disturbing neighbors and wildlife. These features reflect CVSan's commitment to a cleaner, more sustainable future.

Meet Rovver X, one of CVSan's robotic sewer cameras that CVSan's Collection System Maintenance Department uses to inspect Castro Valley's sewer system. By performing closed-circuit television (CCTV) inspections, CVSan can capture real-time footage, revealing any cracks, blockages, or defects that could cause an overflow. By analyzing the data gathered from these inspections, CVSan can determine when maintenance is required and help CVSan's Engineering Department prioritize repair projects for our sewer pipes. # **Organics Tips**

id you know that only organic materials like food scraps, plants, and food-soiled paper go in the green organics carts? There is one exception: compostable plastic bags (usually a light green color) are allowed in organics carts and bins. Food scraps include things like peels and moldy food, but also leftover bones and meat trimmings too.
